## SENATE BILL NO. 2008

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF 2 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR THE SUPPORT AND 3 MAINTENANCE OF FINANCIAL AID SCHOLARSHIP, LOAN AND GRANT PROGRAMS 4 AND THE MISSISSIPPI OFFICE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID, FOR FISCAL 5 YEAR 2026.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees 10 of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the support and maintenance of financial aid scholarship, loan and grant programs 11 12 authorized by law and administered by the Mississippi Office of Student Financial Aid and for support of the Mississippi Office of 13 Student Financial Aid, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, 14 15 and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 47,255,243.00.

SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 16 17 necessary, is hereby authorized out of the proceeds derived from any federal funds, grants, donations, fees, or other special 18 19 source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available

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for the support and maintenance of financial aid scholarship, loan and grant programs authorized by law including funds used as federal matching funds for the GEAR UP Mississippi Scholarship Program and administered by the Mississippi Office of Student Financial Aid and for support of the Mississippi Office of Student Financial Aid, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 10,983,837.00.

27 **SECTION 3.** None of the funds appropriated in this act shall 28 be paid to or for the benefit of any student who applies for the first time, subsequent to July 1, 2025, for assistance through the 29 30 Southeast Asia POW/MIA Grant established under the provisions of Section 37-106-41, the Public Management Graduate Internship 31 32 established under the provisions of Section 37-106-43, the State 33 Medical Education Loan established under the provisions of Section 34 37-106-61, the State Dental Education Loan established under the 35 provisions of Section 37-106-63, the Graduate and Professional 36 Degree Forgivable Loan established under the provisions of Section 37-106-65, the Health Care Professions Forgivable Loan established 37 38 under the provisions of Section 37-106-67, or the Family 39 Protection Specialist Social Worker Forgivable Loan established 40 under the provisions of Section 37-106-69.

41 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that of 42 the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1 of this 43 act, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 44 Learning shall expend from the support of the out-of-state

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50 SECTION 5. In the allocation of funds appropriated under the 51 provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this act, among the student 52 financial aid programs included herein, it is the intention of the 53 Legislature that priority shall be given and funds shall be first 54 allocated to all students eligible for financial aid under the 55 provisions of Section 37-106-39, Mississippi Code of 1972.

56 SECTION 6. All funds provided for in this act shall be 57 accounted for in an annual report, which shall be submitted at the 58 next regular session of the Legislature within ten (10) days after 59 the convening thereof. The report should detail for each grant, 60 scholarship, or loan program the number of recipients, the total 61 amount of awards made, and the average award amount. The report shall include the number of students at each institution receiving 62 63 financial assistance and the amount of such assistance. For loan 64 programs, the report shall also include a summary of the repayment 65 status and method of repayment for student cohorts as well as an 66 accounting of the receipt of funds in repayment. Furthermore, all 67 funds received and expended shall be reported and otherwise 68 accounted for in accordance with the provisions of Section 37-106-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, except where individual 69

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70 identifying information must be withheld pursuant to the Family 71 Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 USC Section 1232g 72 34 CFR Part 99.

No public or private institution of higher learning receiving funds under the respective provisions of this act, for the purpose of issuing scholarship grants or loans, shall issue any official transcripts for any persons who have any amount of repayment in arrears on the date such official transcript is requested.

**SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

83 SECTION 8. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and 84 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be 85 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of 86 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.

87 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that 88 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 89 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 90 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 91 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 92 93 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 94 made without competitive bids.

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95 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 96 act, an amount not to exceed Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) 97 is provided for the Speech-Language Pathologists Loan Forgiveness 98 Program established under the provisions of Section 37-106-73, 99 Mississippi Code of 1972, and administered by the Mississippi 100 Office of Student Financial Aid.

101 SECTION 11. Awards for the Higher Education Legislative Plan 102 Grant Program, authorized by Section 37-106-75, shall be made to 103 applicants meeting all program requirements and found to be in 104 financial need according to the following definition:

105 (a) The family has one (1) child under the age of 106 twenty-one (21), and the annual adjusted gross income of the 107 family is less than Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 108 (\$42,500.00); or

(b) The family has annual adjusted gross income of less than Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$42,500.00) plus Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each additional child under the age of twenty-one (21).

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this act, Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) shall be derived from funds in the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. This amount shall be used for the Fostering Access and Inspiring True Hope (FAITH) Scholarship Program Act established by Section 37-106-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, and the William F. Winter and

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SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that no student should receive undergraduate grant aid through more than one state-supported undergraduate grant program in the same term of enrollment. If a student is eligible for aid through multiple grant programs, the student shall be awarded from the program that awards the larger sum.

128 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that all 129 students must demonstrate eligibility at the conclusion of each 130 term during the regular academic year in order to continue to 131 receive state-supported aid.

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145 (b) Fostering Access and Inspiring True Hope (FAITH) 146 Scholarship Program Act.....\$ 100,000.00 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, 147 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this 148 149 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds 150 remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the 151 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized. 152 153 **SECTION 16.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 154 155 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 156 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer, and the State Fiscal 157 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 158 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 159 SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from 160 and after July 1, 2025.
